Proposal to establish a new All-through School in Llanfyllin

What's happening?

Powys County Council is the organisation which decides how education is organised and provided in Powys. The Council wants to make sure that all children and young people have the chance to go to schools that give them the best possible chances for when they grow up.

At the moment there are two schools in Llanfyllin—Llanfyllin Primary School and Llanfyllin High School. The Council is wondering whether it would be better if these schools merged, to create one new all-through school, providing education to pupils from 4—18 years old.

This would mean that all pupils in the town of Llanfyllin would be part of one school, located on the current sites of the two separate schools.

Pupils that go to other primary schools in the Llanfyllin area would also be able to join the school in year 7.

Why is this happening?

The council is thinking about changing the way education is provided in Llanfyllin because:

- Pupil numbers are going down, especially in the high school
- There is a need to improve the education provided
- There is no permanent headteacher in the primary sector

What would change?

All pupils in Llanfyllin would be part of one school, instead of being part of two separate schools. This would mean that there would be one headteacher.

However, pupils would continue to go to school in the same building they go to now—pupils up to year 6 would still go to the current site of Llanfyllin C.P. School, pupils from year 7 onwards would go to the current site of Llanfyllin High School.

Pupils that go to other primary schools in the Llanfyllin catchment would still be able to go to the school in year 7 when they move to high school.

What will happen next?

This is only an idea at the moment, and no final decision has been made. The council wants to know what people think about this idea. The council will read all the comments sent in, and will decide whether or not to carry on.

If the council does decide to carry on, it will publish something called a 'Statutory Notice' to say that it wants to close the two schools and open a new all-through school. There will be another chance for people to tell us if they don't agree that this should happen. The council will then make a final decision about whether or not to open one new school in the area.
